OUR HISTORY

The Burroughs-VMA ensembles are consistently among America's elite competitions in their divisions. The choirs have won over 150 regional Grand Championships and 13 National Grand Championships spanning our 30 year history of the program.

In 2010, they performed with Foreigner, were featured on Gleeful, a British documentary, and sang at the Season 2 Glee Cast Premier Party at Paramount Studios.





On Ophra's show, she introduced Burroughs as the school that inspired the hit Fox television series "Glee" and requested our choir to perform together with the entire cast of "Glee."

They appeared on ABC's "Dancing with the Stars," and experienced a memorable trip to Hong Kong for the TV show "Cathy Pacific Chinese New Year Night Parade."

Our choirs performed at LACMA with Christina Aguilera and The Canadian Tenors, a YouTube special of "America's Got Talent", a tour of Beijing, China and appeared on China Central Television, as well as the Gala Opening of the Sunnylands Estate, hosted by the Annenberg Family, that featured John Legend. And performed with "Team Christina" in the final round of NBC's "The Voice." At the Hollywood Bowl with Darren Criss, they shared the stage with Steven Tyler, Joe Perry, Patti Austin, John Legend, Stevie Wonder and the Hollywood Bowl Orchestra. They were seen on "Home and Family Christmas Special" on the Hallmark Channel, and also appeared in "Dance the Dream", the tribute to the 50th anniversary of Martin Luther King Jr's "I have a Dream" speech and at LACMA's 50th Anniversary Celebration with Seal/Strange Fruit. They were filmed on an episode "To the Stage" for the Dance Network featuring Powerhouse and performed at the 2016 American Choral Directors Association Conference in Pasadena. Recent students, Josh Strobl, (winner of the National High School Musical Theater Awards) and Brighton Thomas (The 2016 American Songbook Ambassador) are on their way to careers in the music industry.

Brendan Jennings: "I like to call our program a hybrid program. We work on both classical and show music. The balance of the education allows my students to become great musicians, but also great performers. This breadth of experience is very valuable in shaping the future of each student. The students always want to top what they did the year before, and that gives them something to work for. It has raised it to a high level.
